<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sustain/grow PD numbers; includes reviewing patient assessments and keeping the undecided population interested• Enabling patients currently on PD to stay on modality longer• Seamless transitions to PD from Hemodialysis or Renal Health• Looking at increasing # of LTC facilities available to care for PD patients	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sustain/grow PD numbers – ongoing focus. Developing SOP for management of undecided population• Ongoing: Standardizing peritonitis algorithms for both sites; increasing community support• St. B: new workspace facilitates communication between units, formation of CKD 5 clinic• Continue to have 1 facility equipped to handle PD patients

Areas of Focus 2014/2015: Seven Oaks & St. Boniface

- Establish and Implement PD Assist home program under MRP
- Supporting PD patients in communities outside of Winnipeg
- Focused CKD & Modalities Education (CKD 5 clinic)
- PD exit site infection rates

Challenges and Frustrations: Seven Oaks and St. Boniface

Identified in 2013	Outcomes/Updates
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lack of dedicated general anesthesia OR time<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Unpredictable timing of catheter salvage• GA surgical wait times lengthy• Cause of patient loss to HD• Primary catheter non-function rates in ever increasing complex patient population.• Current structure of Assisted PD program not meeting needs of PD community	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Secured regular monthly general anesthesia slate (May 2013); diminished backlog of patients waiting for repositioning or insertion/hernia repair• Assisted PD home program run by homecare now defunct; MRP currently undertaking new initiative

Current Challenges and Frustrations 2014/2015

- SEVEN OAKS:
 - Allocation of nursing resources limited: split between training/catheter insertions/unit treatments and clinics
 - Finding wait times for training patients increased
 - Program growth leading to physical space challenges
 - On-call evening and weekend coverage for PD pending
- ST. BONIFACE:
 - Focus on improving peritonitis rates
 - Lack of PD support systems in northern and rural communities; communications between PD units and northern facilities
