

Haloperidol

What it does:

Haloperidol is use to relieve nausea and vomiting.

How it works:

Haloperidol acts by decreasing the binding of chemical in your brain area that controls nausea.

How and when to take it:

Take as directed. Commonly, you may need 2 to 3 doses per day to control nausea, but everyone responds differently.

What to do if you miss a dose:

If you miss a dose, take the missed dose as soon as you remember. If you do not remember the missed dose until it is almost time for the next dose, just skip to the next dose.

DO NOT DOUBLE YOUR DOSE OR TRY TO “CATCH UP” BY TAKING EXTRA DOSES.

Possible side effects:

The most common side effects are drowsiness, dry mouth, dizziness and constipation.

Occasionally, people on higher doses can feel stiff, and rarely may get a reaction where their neck is very stiff. If this occurs, do not take any more and contact your doctor. You should also contact your doctor if you notice a fast heart beat, difficulty urinating or blurry vision.
